Hardy's On-The-Scene Report:

Jean Hardy, after 10 years on the ranch, has decided to spend winters in the desert, so the Hoolans have graciously agreed to fill in for her winter report:

Weather

We now have 2 feet of snow, days warming up to 15 degrees and the nights around 0. The coldest so far is 10 below. Snowmobiling has been great and each winter we see more and more property owners enjoying the ranch .

Wildlife

The elk herds migrated through the property again this year on the way to winter grazing in the Madison Valley and Wall Creek Game Refuge. The refuge was started approximately 60 years ago and consisted of 5 elk. The estimates for the number of elk this year are about 4000. The herds are a must see if you are in the valley during the winter and are starting to rival the Jackson Hole, Wyoming elk populations.

Our local Rocky Mountain Big Horn Sheep are on the comeback after being almost totally wiped out by pneumonia in the late 90's, the herd at that time was about 60 sheep. Last week we were able to count 25 by the Slide Inn, and all looked to be doing well.

Two dozen deer are still on the property and have not been driven down the valley yet by the snow. As always, 2 or 3 moose are also making the ranch home.

At times, wolf and mountain lion tracks can be seen. The game warden has said that the local wolf pack has no shortage of food with all the elk in the valley!

Happenings

Fish biologists have traps in Spring Creek by the old town, to evaluate the Whirling disease. Their plan is to not graze this year and to rehab the stream just as we have in our common area.

State surveyors have been at work around the bridge. According to the surveyors, if the \$3 bridge conservation project goes through, the state will get 100 acres for access and development.

And yes, the bridge construction is complete. Sure makes getting to the ranch much easier!

Ranch Recipes:

Mountain Sunrise Brunch Cake

This is very easy and a real treat!

3 oz. Cream cheese
 4 T. butter
 2 C. Bisquick mix
 1/3 C. milk
 1/2 C. raspberry preserves

Frosting:

1 C. powdered sugar
 1-2 T. milk
 1/2 t. vanilla

Mix first 3 ingredients with a pastry cutter until crumbly. Blend in milk. Turn out and knead 10 strokes. Roll to a 12x18" rectangle. Turn onto greased baking sheet.

Spread preserves down center lengthwise. Make 2 1/2" cuts at one inch intervals on long sides. Fold strips over preserves.

Bake at 425 for 12-15 minutes. Drizzle with frosting.
